

# Port Douglas, Australia

The laidback tropical town of Port Douglas is the gateway to two UNESCO World Heritagelisted natural wonders, the Great Barrier Reef and the expanses of the Daintree Rainforest.

It's also a popular resort destination in its own right, with the tree-fringed sands of Four Mile Beach stretching down the bay and a leafy, compact town centre lined with hip cafés and bars.

Superyachts from around the world berth at Port Douglas's sheltered marina, where tour boats depart for sightseeing cruises to nearby coral cays and expeditions to spectacular diving spots on the outer reefs.



You'll find the oldest surviving tropical rainforest in the world, the Daintree Rainforest (estimated to be 180 million years old) around an hour's drive north of Port Douglas.

Browse ethically sourced aboriginal art at the indigenous fine art gallery, see a giant saltwater crocodile propel itself out of the water to snatch food, or jump on a boat to get up close to these massive creatures at Hartley's crocodile adventures.



Port Douglas is a quintessential seaside village, an ideal haven for switching off and forgetting the constraints of metropolitan life, and most certainly a spot where good old fashioned retail therapy is not forgotten.

In the few hundred metres along the main street, you can discover a shopping utopia with everything from recognised brands, chic resort wear, on trend Australian and European labels, exquisite handcrafted jewellery and wide brimmed sun hats - this is tropical lifestyle living at it's very best.
